Government 2.0 – Engaging and Empowering Citizens Senator Kate Lundy

Web 2.0 tools and online communities are now a part of normal society. Governments around the world are looking at how they can better interact with citizens, better serve citizens and better empower citizens to innovate for themselves. Senator Lundy will discuss how she is experimenting with Web 2.0 technologies and methodologies and the lessons therein. Her world-leading Public Spheres initiative is changing how people think about public policy development, and the part a citizen can directly play, especially those too busy to engage in time-consuming traditional models.



Senator Kate Lundy has represented the Australian Capital Territory in the Australian Federal Parliament since 1996. In that time she had many portfolios in opposition including ICT, Manufacturing, Consumer Affairs, Sport and Health Promotion. Senator Lundy is currently Chair of the Joint Standing Committee for the National Capital and External Territories. She is a long-standing member of the Senate Environment, Communications and the Arts Committee.
